Lent at Christ Church

Lent is a time of holy discipline, a time to work on our own spiritual practices, and try new things. This Lent we're engaging as a community in a number of different practices, and everyone is welcome to join.

Sunday Mornings – 10:00 in the rector's office: Questions of Faith – an informal discussion group about the whys and wonderings of faith. This is for everyone – those who have been at church for a long time, and those who are new. It's a chance to ask the questions you've always had, and to hear other's questions.

Tuesday Evenings – 6:30-7:45 we will be working through the course "Just Walk Across the Room", presented by Bill Hybels.
