## The Gathering of the Community

This is the day that Christ the Lamb of God gave himself into the hands of those who would kill him. This is the day that Christ gathered with his disciples in the upper room. This is the day that Christ took a towel and washed the disciple's feet, giving us an example that we should do to others as he has done to us. This is the day that Christ our God gave us this holy feast, that we who eat this bread and drink this cup may here proclaim his Holy Sacrifice and be partakers of his resurrection and at the last day may reign with him in heaven.

This is a day of anticipation. It is a day of eating together, of sharing important meals with friends. It is a day of journeys. The ancient Hebrew people gathered on this night to eat their last meal as slaves in the land of Egypt. Jesus and his closest friends gathered on this night to eat their last supper together as a community. For both the ancient Hebrew people, and for Jesus and his followers, this night would be the last night of calm before their lives were turned upside down.

And so, we too, gather on this holy night. We gather as a community to eat together, to share the bread and wine of the Eucharist together, and to prepare ourselves for the disruptions of Good Friday. We gather to make our own journey toward Good Friday, from the cheer and fellowship of the hall and narthex to the solemnity of the church, and eventually the starkness of the bare altar.

As we gather tonight we are thankful to God for this good food that we have to share, for this community with whom we can share it, and the freedom to meet publicly as followers of Jesus. Supper is shared
